

President's Report, by MTSSAR President Warren Dupuis

As President, I participated in the following activates throughout the community:

- 1. Several planned activities were cancelled due to COVID-19 and the associated "lockdown" including; the Welcome Home for Vietnam Veterans (March 30), East Helena Memorial Day Parade (May 25), Chapter Meetings, etc.
- 2. On July 4th, I attended the Veteran's Memorial in Ennis, MT. I gave coins to the Organizer and Master of Ceremonies of the event.
- 3. On September 7th, I participated in the Dillon Labor Day parade where the DAR and SAR had two floats. During the parade I had a chance to talk with Senator Daines and Congressman Gianforte. Congressman Gianforte took a selfie with SAR members, along with the float and posted it on his Facebook page. I gave a coin to Don Reed for is work in developing the SAR "camp" float.
- 4. On September 11th, I participate in a DAR Marker ceremony at the Pioneer Cabin in Helena. I gave a coin to Ellen Baumler, an interpretative historian for the Montana Historical Society.
- 5. On September 15th, I attended a meeting of the Liberty Tree Chapter and presented a coin to Dite Little for his efforts in driving the DAR USS Montana float to Dillon so that it could be in the Labor Day parade.
- 6. On September 17th, members of the Guardian Chapter, along with members of the Oro Fino Chapter of the DAR, participated in Constitution Day activities at the State Capitol. - Joe Geldrich of Missoula. The applicant is a DNA situation. As I have no experience with DNA, PG Joe Dooley helped me. I sent entire package to him and he forwarded to GG Jim Faulkinbury. When he reviewed he shut down all DNA at National SAR, including some already at National on 6 Nov 2019. Then on 14 Sep 2020 the SAR sent out new DNA rules. The only link allowed is the first GEN, or biological parent. Sadly, Joe Geldrich cannot meet this requirement.

All applicants are responsible for supplying all documents for their application. I do not have weeks, months or years to do the research. Barb Stem of Butte Silver Bow Chapter DAR has been very capable help. As she has a very excellent knowledge of application preparation: both DAR and SAR.

One problem is where the blood line changes to the maternal side. That marriage must be proven. This can be a real problem and I write a number of proof arguments on these situations.

Every name, date and location must have an approved document to show same or it cannot be put on application. Attention to detail is everything. Plus understanding the 70 plus or minus pages of the SAR pages for the preparation of applications.

Chapter News

Sourdough Chapter by John Rice, Sourdough Chapter President

In April 2020 the Sourdough Chapter had 25 members. Since then it has added no new Montana members. However, there is a list of ten potential new Sourdough Chapter candidates, two of which have indicated that they hope to get their applications done soon. Two Wyoming SAR Society Big Horn Basin Chapter members, Keith Francik and Walter Hartung, have joined the Sourdough Chapter as dual members. Sourdough Chapter member Timo Platt has moved to Arizona for business reasons. The chapter now has 26 members.

Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic no Sourdough Chapter meetings have been held since April 2020. Pete Oakander built the wooden model of the USS Montana Submarine for the joint MTSSAR / MSDAR float and helped integrate the model into the float. Sourdough members Pete Oakander, John Rice, John Robinson, and Rodney Wheeler participated in the Big Timber Rodeo Parade with this float. Pete also participate with the float in the Dillon Parade. The Tent: This is a historically correct wedge tent, in use from the French and Indian War, American Revolution, War of 1812, Mexican War, and American Civil War. Canvas wedge tents were the most popular tent design in America from 1755 through the 1860s. This 7'X7'X7' tent would have provided shelter for three enlisted rank soldiers.

Flag's: On display we had both a Betsy Ross pattern garrison flag and guidon both consisting of the Valley Forge Heritage series. Valley Forge. PA. The Betsy Ross flag is an early design of the flag of the United States, named for early American upholsterer and flag maker Betsy Ross.

Camp Chores: We had on display a two man saw which was in common usage in 17th century thru 19th Century America. For cooking chores we displayed an Iron tripod suspending the ever popular cast iron Dutch oven. Speaking of which, the patent for the cast iron Dutch oven was obtained in 1707 by Welshman, James Thomas.

For chopping kindling, we displayed a period correct, forged headed tomahawk. To accommodate our Dragoons and Dispatch riders, we displayed an antique English saddle equipped with Bear Hide covered pommel holsters, period correct saddle bags, saber and the afore mentioned Guidon Flag.

Our center piece: The wonderful replica of an English six pounder Cannon, provided by Bob Gunderson.
